6. **Organizational Background** Education For All Somalia Coalition (EFASOM is a local NGO non-profit making National education coalition formed as NGO, at least 29 members of civil society groups working to ensure all Somali people their rights to quality, safe education and better livelihoods, health and water. EFASOM was established in 2006 by a group of scholars and education activists in Somalia and registered at the Ministry of Interior, Federal Government and authorizations to implement activities.
7. **Education Context** In 2022, Somalia one of the lowest primary school enrollment rates in the world. Every 6 in 10 children eligible for primary and secondary education in Somalia are outside of the education system. Just 30% of all school-age children have access to learning opportunities, with over 3 million children remaining out of school according the education sector analysis in 2022 produced by the Ministry of Education.

13. Key learning expected outcomes

- Gender equality: To get rid of barriers to equal access and retention of girls in education are addressed.
- Access to education: Access to equitable education in rural and urban areas is increased by addressing barriers in both the areas of demand and supply by focusing on promoting the right to inclusive education for boys and girls in different circumstances such as internally displaced, child labor, street children, urban poor, youth minority groups, refugee returnees, nomads in far-reachable areas, children with disabilities and disadvantaged girls.

15. Organizational Achievements

EFASOM so far implemented education projects in collaboration with Global Campaign for Education (GCE) under the Civil Society Education Fund project (CSEF); Oxfam Denmark; Arab Campaign for Education for All (ACEA); and Global Partnership for Education (GPE).

FY 2006

In 2006, with the help from EFASOM, school children discussed how they could support their friends out of school to get an education.



FY 2007

In 2007, EFASOM organized a Global Action Week for Education with a massive human chain. Education Activists presented their demand to the government by asking for the enforcement of free compulsory education.



FY 2008

In 2008, In this Global Action Week (21-27 April 2008), more than 1500 villagers in 7 main cities in south and central zone of Somalia joined 80 teachers and their students in 110 primary schools to the action week.



FY 2009

In 2009, EFASOM selected 8 March the Women's Day as a National Highlight Event under the slogan "Open Books, Open Doors, Schools Must Be Violence-Free Zones". In the Global Action Week (21-27 April 2009), EFASOM national coordinators developed an exciting action, the "aan ku biirno inta aqrida" [let's join readers] to mobilize universities and secondary/primary schools to take part in the Big Read "April 22nd 2009".



FY 2010

In 2010, EFASOM reached utmost coverage countrywide for the Action Week 19-26 April 2010. At about 1500 primary, secondary schools and universities ensured to their involvement in the action.



FY 2011

In 2011, We have made assessment of 4 IDP settlements and 25 primary and secondary schools in Mudug, Nugal, Karkaar, and Bari regions of Puntland and have sat with the Regional Education Officers of these regions. With the help of REOs, EFASOM signed an MOU with schools visited. The letter of understanding shows extensive cooperation and collaboration in providing services to students in the region between EFASOM and these schools.

Needs for Vocational Training:

In the year 2011, EFASOM also made survey of need assessment from Bossaso fishermen. Young fishers in seashores like Bossasso, Benderbella, Hafon, LasQorey, Gara'ad, and all other coastal areas are in need to get TVET, Technical Vocational Education Training.



Needs for NFE for Adult Education: Adult students who missed education during their school ages now re-started attending schools.

In 2011, there was a gap in teacher sponsorship in these adult learning centres. EFASOM did assessment from NFE schools in Galkayo like SYL NFE Mudug centre and Shebelle Adult centre.



Needs for Hygiene Education: There is a need for increased investment in sanitation and hygiene interventions. In situations of poor hygiene as seen in most of schools and residential areas in Puntland, the preservation of sanitation and hygiene is an enormously big challenge.



Needs of Primary Schools: Primary schools in Puntland are in need to get facilities such as provision of textbooks

and benches & desks, school renovation, construction of playgrounds, sponsorship of girls education and orphans, teacher-performance-rewards, teacher training.



Needs of Secondary Schools: Secondary Schools in Puntland in 2011 were in dare need to get laboratories, libraries, machinery facilities like photocopy and school buses, textbooks, playgrounds, and sports



Needs of Tertiary Schools Tertiary schools in Puntland are in need to higher education promotion, where girls and boys need to get scholarships and bursaries. The MOE is happy to get office equipment facilities like VSAT, desktop computers, laptops, archive centres.

FY 2022

On January 22nd 2022, School grants given to 616 Somali primary schools to support the enrolment of 25,000 out-of-school children, funds provided by the GPE to the Somalia Federal Ministry of Education and State-level education ministries as part of \$25.9 million of ESPIG.



On 23rd January 2022, EFASOM advocated 370 families with children who have recently, been displaced by the drought and whose livestock have also been wiped out

arrived in Mogadishu this week. These people have not received any assistance either from the government or for humanitarian agencies.



On February 1st 2022, EFASOM campaigned Low public awareness about autism represents a challenge in Somalia. Many autistic children miss opportunities for early treatment, often kept behind closed doors. In Mogadishu, 60 autistic children are receiving care in Mustaqbal Center for Special Needs.



On March 14th 2022, EFASOM demanded "It is important that young deaf graduates from schools/universities get a job placement so that they can be role models to all children with special needs who are now in schools." says EFASOM Coordinator while addressing a job placement meeting of youth with special needs.



On March 22, 2022, EFASOM members of the Somali coalition conducted a field visit to the camps for the displaced, the reality of education for displaced children. The government should work to equip displaced children in the national education system from the start of the emergency.



On April 5, 2022 EFASOM demanded the Government to provide education for children in displaced IDP camps.



EFASOM joined a validation workshop for a continental study on the state of protection of education from attacks and military use in Africa and a mapping report of national, sub-regional and Africa Union policies on peace education on April 11-15, 2022 Hilton Hotel, Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

2nd July 2023, EFASOM and SONUT jointly started a 2 day community sensitisation meeting focusing on teachers awareness raising on the right to education for out of school children. The participants drew attention to the negative consequences of not having basic education for the children.



On July 13th 2023, Somali NGO Consortium and local actors discussed localization, challenges the NNGOs face at project cooperations, challenges during interventions and proposed recommendations how improve partnerships with INGOs, donors, or UN agencies in order to provide humanitarian aid.

20th July 2023 EFASOM representatives of Somalia had been participating in the Arab Educational Policy Dialogue Forum, which was held in Tunisia and whose activities began, July 19, 2023. We presented a research paper in which we focus on the need to finance education in Somalia.



On 10th August 2023 In Nairobi , Oxfam-Denmark and IDS-UK jointly closed a 3-day workshop on the EOL action research on education advocacy in challenging context, prioritized 11 NECs: Somalia, SSudan, Chad, Burkina Faso, Zimbabwe, Mosampige, Eswathini, Mayanmar, Filipine, Bangladesh, Pakistan.



On July 24th 2023 Safwa Foundation and EFASOM jointly concluded a 2-day community awareness meeting that focused on awareness of the right to education for out-of-school children. This meeting was taking place in Jowhar in the main city of Hirshabelle.



EFASOM concluded a 3-day Board and staff training: Project management; budgeting; and fighting fraud in NGOs in 22-24 Aug 2023 in Mogadishu as discussed: 1. What areas of suspect of fraud? 2. What best strategies to implement project? 3. How to prepare activity based budget



24th August 2023 EFASOM and YECO jointly organized sensitization meeting with all stakeholders and government to create a road-map to enact education policies on accessibility in Adaado district and to engage in an in-depth discussion regarding enacting accessibility in education.



24th August 2023 EFASOM and Greenlight Association were jointly campaigning Education for out of school children in Baidoa, South West State of Somalia. The campaigning program was launched by the governor of Baidoa Education District, Yusuf Mohamed idiris.



31st August 2023 the last day of EiE Global Advocacy workshop in Addis Ababa on 29-31/8/23 aimed to bring together passionate individuals and organisations including EFASOM to combat the learning crisis caused by global emergencies. GCE EiE Global Advocacy ProtectEiENow education INEE



23th September 2023 in Kismayo, EFASOM and SOGHA Girls' Hope have jointly advocated for girls' education with the support from the MoE of Jubaland Federal State, OxfamDenmark and GPE under the Education OutLoud (EOL). Girls at all levels at primary, secondary, and tertiary were involved.



On 22nd September 2023, EFASOM participated action research evidence-based advocacy training in Arusha Tanzania.



8th October 2023 EFASOM Board members and the EOL program staff discussed the progresses of the activities implementation plan to close-out the project before end of the year. They also discussed about new partnerships expected next year.

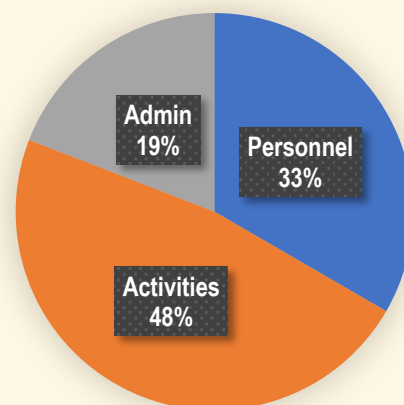

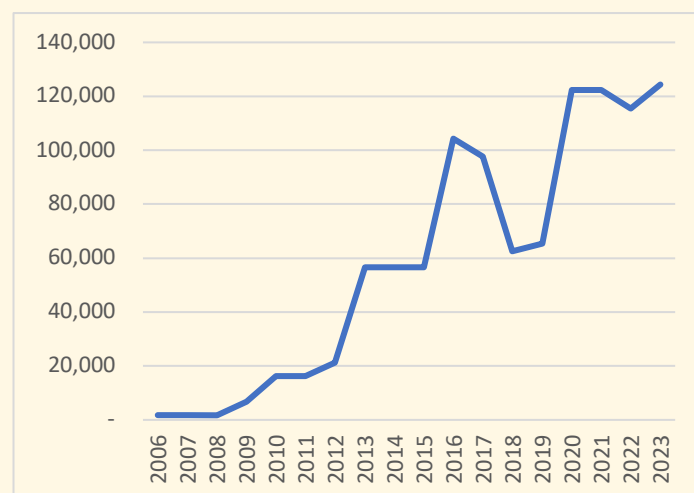

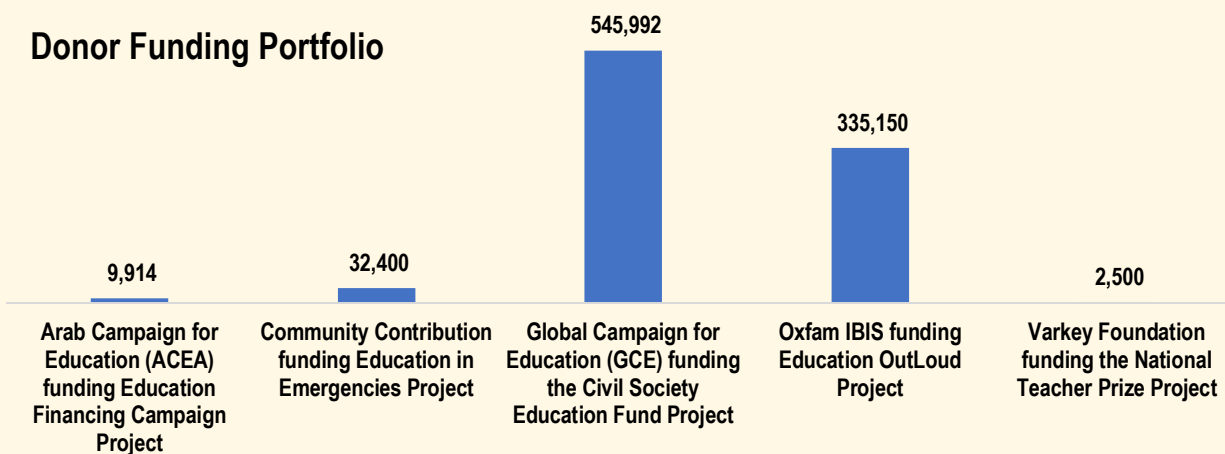
The above graph shows % allocation to the direct cost of activities, staff salaries and administration.

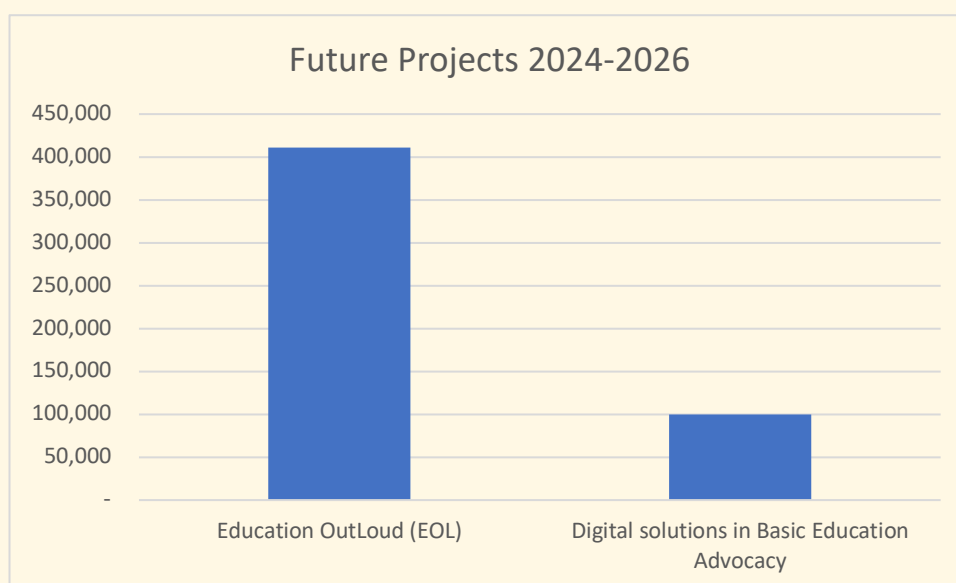
This graph shows level of implementation per year since established EFASOM from 2006 to 2023.
